# EXCEL FOR RESEARCHERS

## What is Excel For Researchers? (Excel Fu)

Excel Fu can be considered as a 'high state' of MS Excel use. In this case, it is a course designed for researchers to make the most of this everyday tool, to discover and unleash its hidden powers to import and manipulate data sets and assist in answering common types of research questions.

This workshop runs over one day and comprises of a series of hands-on exercises modelled around a mock research project. Attendees will leave with two key skills – how to handle their research data within Excel, and how to use advanced features of Excel to answer research questions pertaining to their data.

## Is it a difficult course?

This one-day course assumes a minimum of regular basic use of Excel.

## Where can I sign up?

This is a fully subsidised course offered by Intersect to Researchers at Intersect's member Universities. HDR students are welcome to attend. Register Online.

## What do I bring?
