



ADP Success Rates: 2013-2018




ADP Applications: 2013-2018

What can you do?



- Establish/develop strategic partnerships with key stakeholders (university, industry and government) to co-design collaborative projects, seek funding and produce quality research outputs and impact
- Investigate new area of research with leading groups (nationally and/or internationally)
- Investigate and learn new innovative skills from leading research groups
- Take up a prestigious fellowship
- Write a book for a quality publisher (that you have a contract for)
- Build/accelerate your research profile
- Contribute to the Institution's profile
- NOT BAU

Tips for your Application



- What will you do, why do you want to do it and why do you need ADP to do
 it?
- How does what you want to do align with your School Research plans/priorities, the Research and Innovation Plan, Securing Success?
- Are you ambitious enough with research outcomes? Have you demonstrated your capacity to complete the program; for example, have any previous periods of ADP leave been productive? What were the outcomes?
- **Who** will you work with, why are they the best option? Demonstrate you have an established relationship (letters on invitation detailing when, support, access.....)

Tips for your Application



- Where will you undertake ADP can be in Sydney consider working at another site? Can be undertaken in Australia. Could be with an industry partner – explain why this is the right location and how it will strengthen University's networks
- What will be the outputs/impacts identify for each segment of your ADP.
 - Publications
 - Grant applications, international funding opportunities
 - Data sets
 - Skill acquisition
- What will be the benefit for the University?
- NOT BAU activities

ADP Timing



- 22 week block period in one half of the year (as currently allowed in the procedures)
- 2 x 11 week block periods to be taken over a 2 year period
- 3 x 7 week block periods to be taken over a 2 year period
- Absent for one teaching period.

In most cases, you will not be able to apply for ADP to undertake HDR study, unless:

- It is for a Doctoral degree relevant to the staff member's role
- You do not hold equivalent qualification
- There has been no opportunity to incorporate the program into your workload
- The ADP will result in the completion of the degree and has the support of a supervisor (letter of support to be included); you must have a satisfactory program time-line showing how the higher degree will be completed
- No previous ADP has been granted to work on the degree.

Equity



- Applicants are invited to provide a brief personal statement on any relevant personal considerations that will facilitate an assessment of their achievements relative to opportunity which is relevant to their application.
- Relevant personal circumstances or arrangements can include: family
 responsibilities, a temporary or permanent disability, relevant cultural
 expectations or circumstances, periods of part time work and absences due to
 ill-health or injury
- Committees take these statements seriously, but their relevance to the application needs to be clear.
