
CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Accreditation	The Planning Institute of Australia (PIA) has accredited the Western four-year Planning Pathway, which consists of a three-year Bachelor of Planning, followed by the Master of Urban Management and Planning. Students completing these two courses concurrently are eligible for membership of the PIA.	
Pathways	Students enrolled in the three-year Western Bachelor of Planning receive guaranteed entry into the Master of Urban Management and Planning upon the successful completion of the degree. Students of the Master's degrees may exit early, following the successful completion of the relevant units to fulfil the Graduate Certificate. Additionally, students may enrol in the Graduate Certificate and continue on to complete the Masters.

MASTER OF PLANNING

The Master of Planning degree has been designed to equip students with the professional and scholarly education to take a leadership role in statutory town planning practice as well as policy development. The Western Sydney University Parramatta campus location in the centre of Sydney's population growth area represents a rich urban laboratory in which to explore the most important urban issues.

WHAT YOU'LL STUDY

The Master of Planning is a two-year course in urban and regional planning offered by Western Sydney University. This course is accredited by the Planning Institute of Australia. The course equips our students with professional and scholarly education to take a leadership role in statutory town planning practice as well as policy development. It has a strong emphasis on research rooted in social sciences and in the fast growing Western Sydney region. The coursework includes learning and training in history and theory, governance, professional practice, economic development, sustainability, transport planning, spatial analysis and legal frameworks for planning.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES


Urban and regional planners advise on the environmental needs, restrictions and guidelines of a particular area and develop policies for the use of land and resources. They frequently liaise with community and government representatives as well as undertaking a large amount of research that they subsequently write reports on.
