**Abstract:**

An overview discussion of the complex structures employed by multinational enterprises ("MNEs") to minimize world-wide taxation and maximize the non-tax benefits of using various subsidiary entities. This presentation is intended to be suitable for those who are not necessarily tax-oriented. Recent developments within the European Union have shed light on the practices of some MNEs and the surprising practices of some member states of the EU. Many MNEs have achieved very favorable results from these structures, which (1) invoke diverse private law subjects, (2) raise intriguing public law policy issues, and (3) remind us of the many competencies required of our students when they enter the profession.
