SEXUAL ASSAULT IS A CRIME.

Western Sydney University recognises the seriousness of sexual assault and the impacts that this crime has on people who have experienced sexual assault.

The University is committed to providing respectful, efficient, caring and safe responses to students or staff who have been affected by sexual assault.

WHAT IS SEXUAL ASSAULT?

Sexual Assault is a crime, that can happen to anyone, any age, any gender, any cultural background or sexual orientation.

Sexual assault refers to any sexual behaviours which lead to a person feeling threatened or uncomfortable, unsafe or fearful.

Sexual assault is **NEVER** the responsibility of the person who has been assaulted and is often perpetrated by someone known to the person.

People committing the crime of sexual assault often use tactics to make a person feel responsible for the sexual assault. This can make it frightening for someone to have the courage to reach out for help.

INFORMED CONSENT

To give consent you need to have an understanding of what is happening.

A person who is under the influence of drugs or alcohol or who is asleep is unable to give informed consent.

Additionally consent needs to be free of any type of coercion, for example threats, intimidation or harassment.

Support services can help you to confirm if you have provided informed consent.

TALK TO SOMEONE

It takes courage to reach out and we are here to support you.

If you have experienced an uncomfortable sexual experience, talking to someone can really help.
