Author Guidelines: Global Development Working Paper Series

Western Sydney University Research Group (URG) Humanitarian and Development Research Initiative (HADRI) invites submissions to its *Global Development Working Paper Series*.

Contributions to the *Global Development Working Paper Series* aim to highlight one or more of the following categories:

- Development in the Global South;
- State/territory or regional case studies that pertain to development issues;
- Discussions of broader development policy.

The HADRI *Global Development Working Paper Series* aims to provide an opportunity for researchers to submit ideas that constitute a work-in-progress which will be published online but which can, with some theoretical development or engagement with critique, be submitted to a journal or edited volume. Preference will be given to original research that have findings with broader applicability.

Submission are first reviewed by the Working Paper Series staff, who determine whether they concern themes appropriate for publication in the series. If deemed acceptable for publication as a working paper, submissions are then sent to two reviewers with appropriate disciplinary expertise. The review process is swift—the aim is to improve the quality of the work, not to reject it.

Researchers from the Global South in particular are encouraged to contact the editor (A. Prof Patrick Kilby: P.Kilby@westernsydney.edu.au) to discuss ideas for publication.

Contributions should conform to the following guidelines:

- 2,000-3,000 words of text (not including references or footnotes).
- A 150 word abstract should be provided with the submission, as well as the author(s) name, affiliation(s) and short 50 word bio.
- In text referencing will be in Harvard style (Author, date: page number).
- All References will conform to the HADRI referencing guidelines (provide link here).
