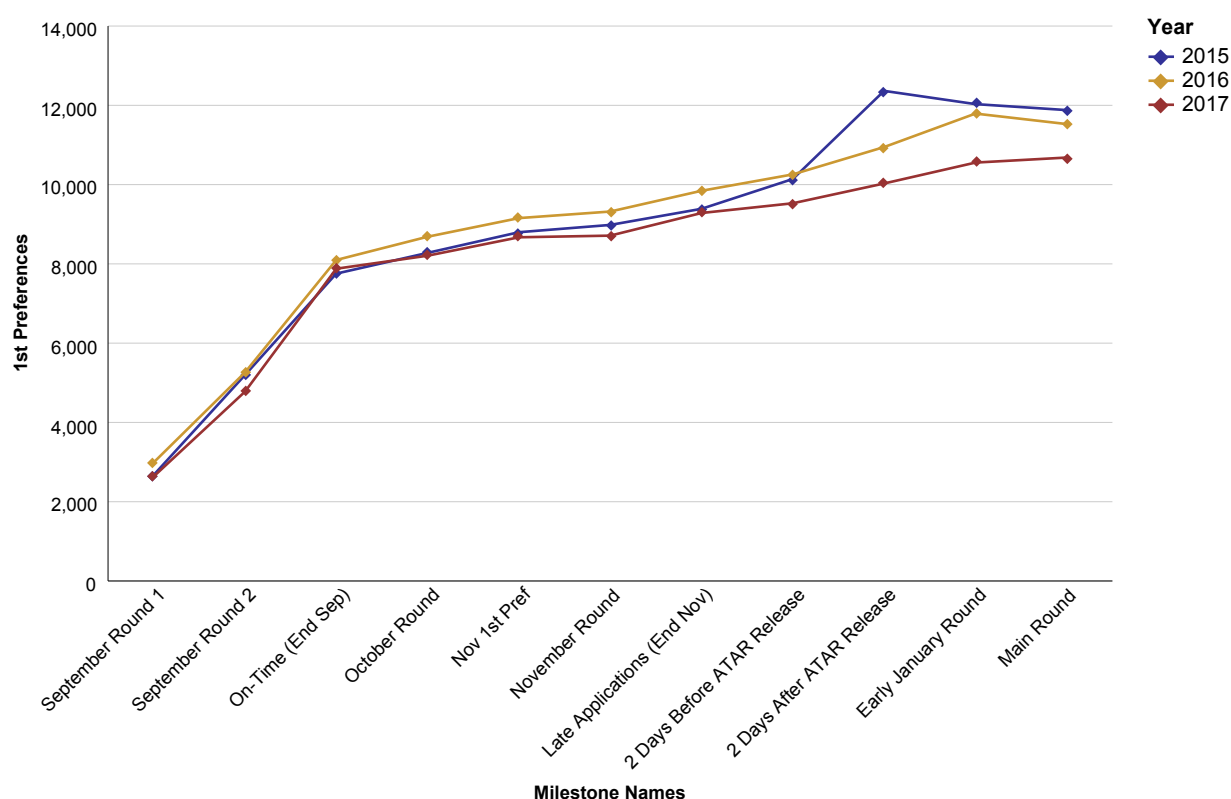

Report Overview

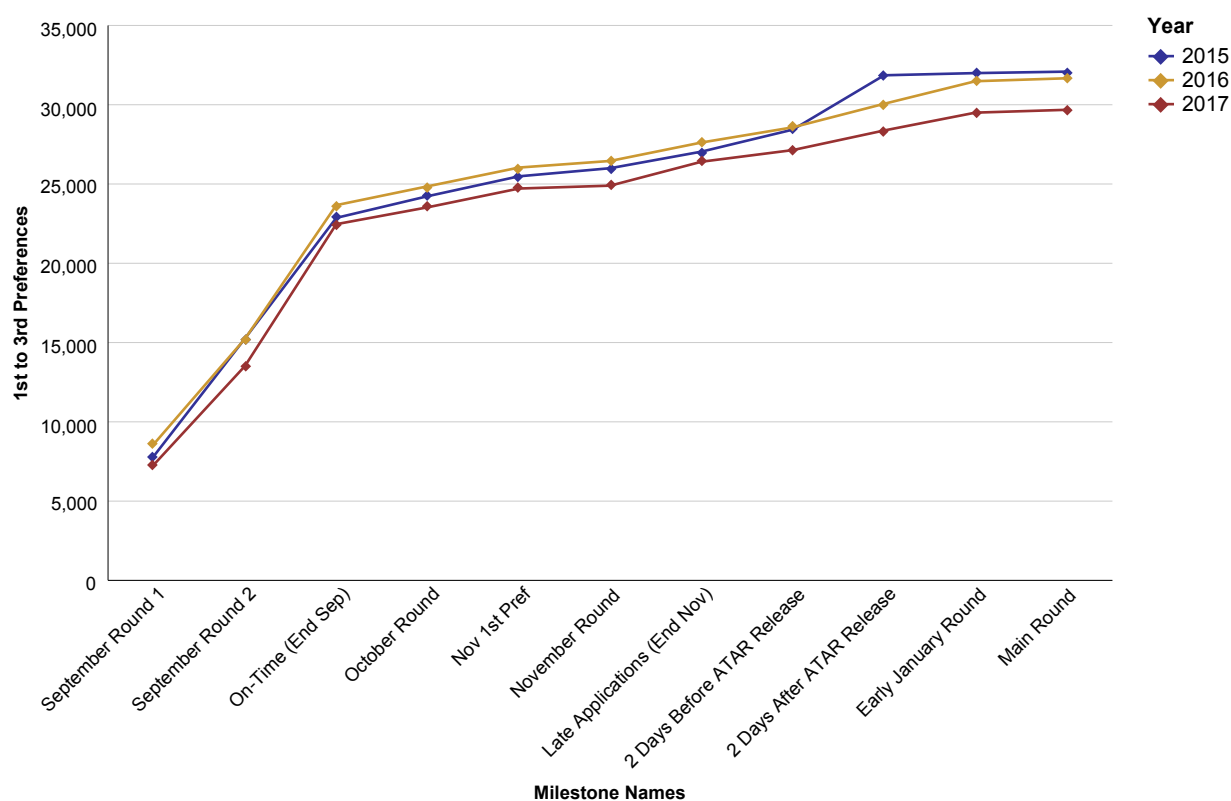

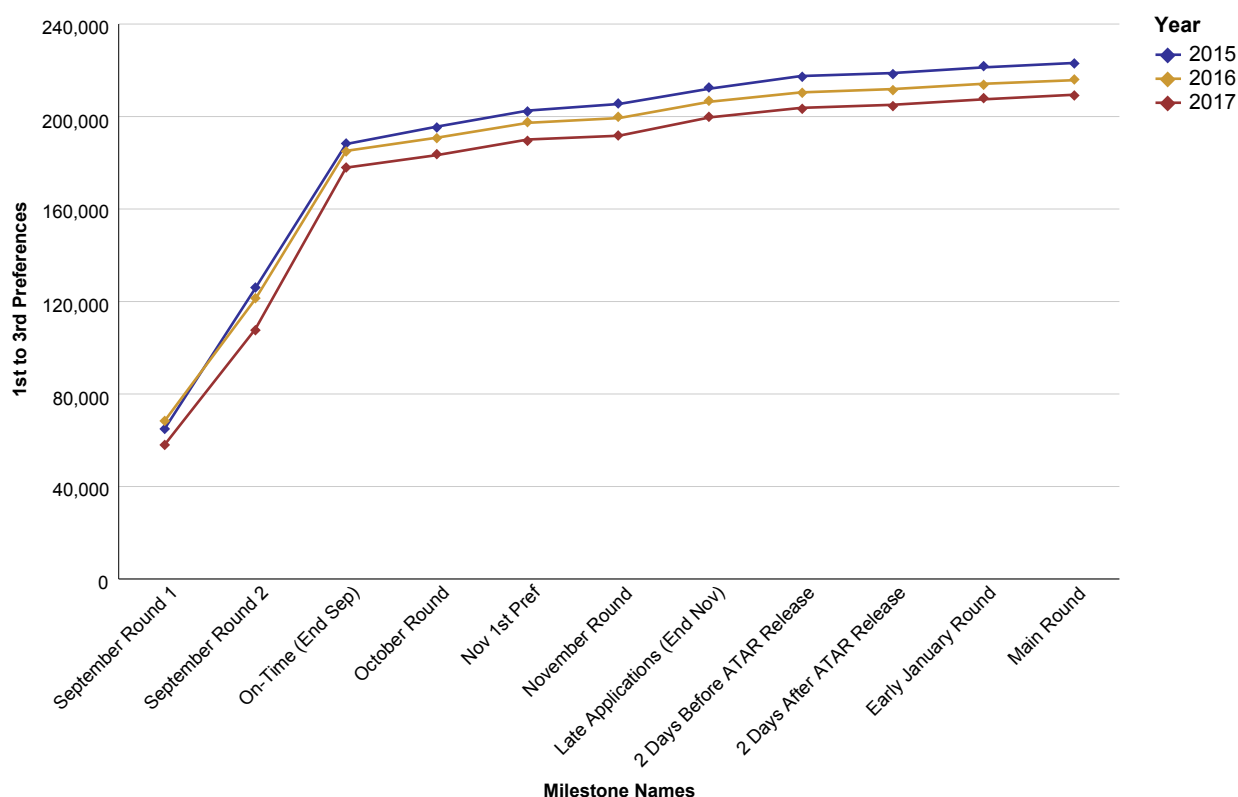

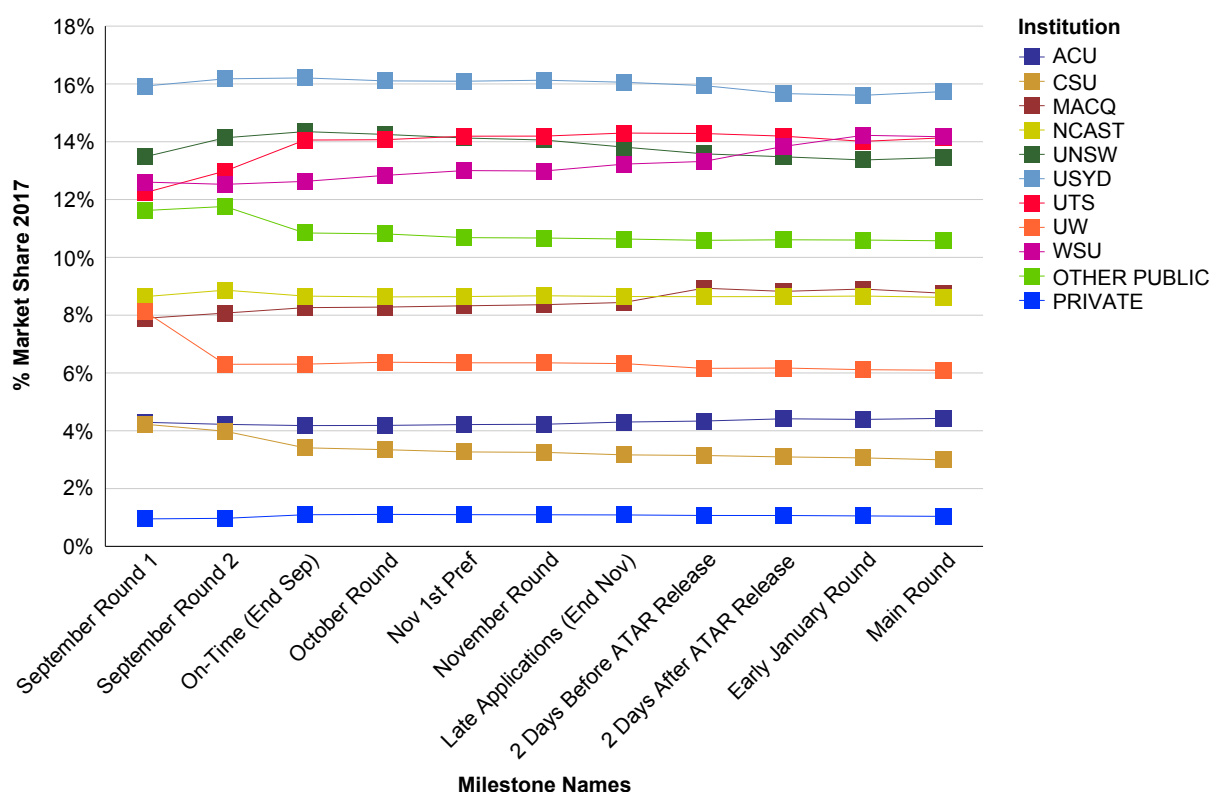

General Notes

2. ** The total may have a small variance, including preferences for courses not allocated to a school at the time of running the report.

Glossary

<i>Preference</i>	A candidate's application to a course at a participating UAC institution. Candidates may specify up to 9 course preferences where the first preference is the applicant's most desired course. Therefore, each preference is counted separately. For example, if an applicant has their first 3 preferences to WSU, this will be counted as 3 preferences for WSU when looking at the count of 1st-3rd preferences. If they have one of their first 3 preferences at 3 different institutions this will be counted once for each institution when looking at the count of 1st-3rd preferences.											
<i>Milestone</i>	By default data will be collected at each of the published UAC admissions process milestones. These are published on the UAC website or on the inside cover of the UAC Guide. Also additional milestone dates have been included to coincide with a particular WSU student recruitment event/activity, such as before and after the ATAR release.											
<i>Intake Year</i>	The calendar year in which successful candidate will start their course (not taking into account deferments or intentions to defer). For example in August 2015 applications open for commencing studies in the 2016 intake year.											
<i>Intake Name</i>	Due to different course start dates for different universities, the term 'Intake Name' has been created to compare preferences by intakes.
