

Since the early 1990's, many governments globally are increasingly adopting the PPP concept






- Countries including the U.K., Australia and Canada are at the top level of PPP practice
- China, South Africa, India and Brazil are rapidly making progress




❖ PPP investments in developing regions from 1990 to 2018









Status	Period expired (Now with HK gov't)
Concession period	30 years
Source of Funds	Equity (20% gov't share)
Opened	1972


- ❖ Government commitment and support for the project
- No competing projects existed or created
- Project was of high demand
- Innovation and technology was employed during operations

Sydney Cross City Tunnel (Australia)





Country	Australia
Amount	AUD 680 million
Year of initiation	2002
PPP model	DBO
Status	Operation with different consortium
Concession period	30 years
Opened	2005



- High toll charges
- ❖ Inaccurate traffic forecast
- Lack of government support










Country	Australia
Amount	5.5 Billion Euros
Year of initiation	1986
PPP model	DBOT
Status	Operation with ET company
Concession period	65 years
Opened	1994

- Competitive tendering process (Had 4) bidders)
- ❖ Has high demand (21 million passengers in 2014)
- Government commitment and support
- Operational issues (breakdown of services)



- PPP practice vary among developing and developed countries/economies
- Countries need to learn from international experiences
- PPP projects/investments will increase significantly in the next decade both in developing and developed countries

 - Sustainability assessment of PPP projects
