## <u>Guidance Document on the State Education Research Applications</u> <u>Process (SERAP) for research involving NSW public schools and for the</u> <u>use of NSW Department of Education data sets</u>

All researchers aiming to do research in public schools or using departmental data need to go through a <u>State Education Research Application Process</u> (SERAP). All SERAP applications must be completed online, whereby the principal researcher creates an account through the <u>Researcher Login</u>. Researchers who have submitted SERAP applications before 2015 have had an account created for them and will need to <u>contact</u> the SERAP team for activating their accounts. Researchers will then have to complete basic profile information before being able to access their dashboard and create a new application and/or browse existing applications. For applicants that are creating a new application, the application consists of a series of questions about the reasons and plans for conducting research.

If research involves contact with children then the applicant is required to provide evidence of their <u>Working with Children Check</u>.

## **Useful Information**

- SERAP Applications are only approved for **12 months**.
- On average they taken 4-6 weeks to complete depending on the complexity of the research application and whether modifications are requested by assessors.
- Principal researchers should be the applicants for SERAP.
- Any amendments to existing projects need to go through the application process again.
- A Final Report must be provided to <u>SERAP</u> and an Executive Summary must be circulated to all of the school Principals involved in the research.
