Professor Michael Adams

Michael's specialist areas are corporate law and governance. He is an expert in financial services regulation (particularly securities markets, insider trading) and the broader area of legal education and technology. Professor Adams has been the Dean at UWS since 2007. Michael writes and presents regularly on these topics, as well as a major media commentator, through TV, radio, newspapers and online forums.



Professor Carolyn Sappideen

Carolyn Sappideen joined UWS School of Law in 1996. Previously she was Deputy Dean at the University of Queensland. She was Chair of the School of Law, University of Western Sydney for the period 1998 to 2006. In 2007 she resumed the position as Professor of Law. Her main area of expertise is Torts Law but has research interests and expertise also in Property Law, Electricity and Employment Law



Professor Donna Craig

Donna Craig is a specialist in international, comparative and national environmental law and policy (LLM, York University,1983). She was one of the founders of Macquarie University Centre for Environmental Law (1983) and a key member of the Centre until her current appointment as a Professor of Environmental Law, School of Law, at the University of Western Sydney.



Associate Professor Susan Armstrong

Associate Professor Susan Armstrong's research and supervision interests embrace family law, dispute resolution, legal responses to culture, domestic violence and legal education. Susan was appointed the School of Law's Director of Research for 2015-2017.



Dr Catherine Renshaw

Catherine Renshaw is a Senior Lecturer in the School of Law at the University of Western Sydney. Her research focuses on human rights and democracy in Southeast Asia. She is an editor of the Journal of South Asian Law, the author of numerous journal articles and book chapters, and between 2008 and 2010 was Director of an Australian Research Council project based at the Australian Human Rights Centre at the University of New South Wales.

Dr Alpana Roy researches and teaches in intellectual property law, with a particular interest in trade marks, copyright, international intellectual property law, and cultural aspects of intellectual property (including traditional and indigenous knowledge).
