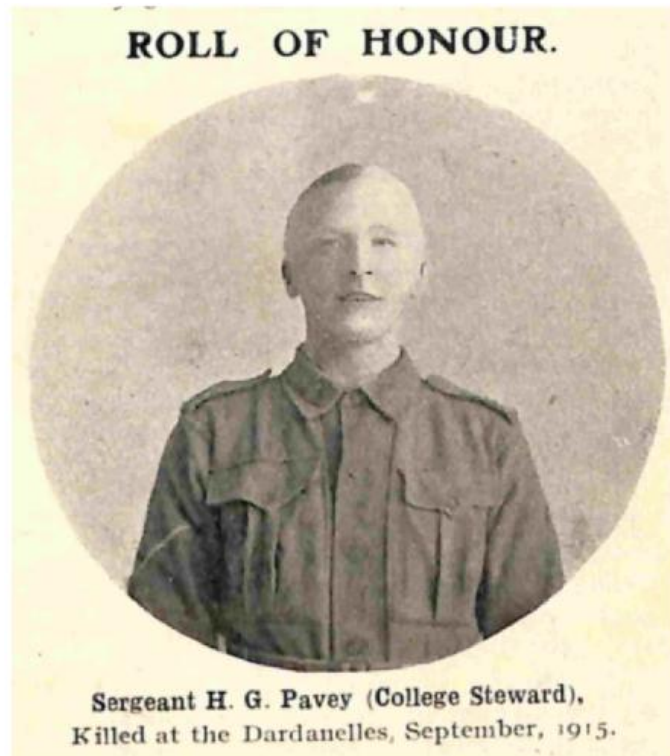


PAVEY, Harold Gilbert

Little is known about Harold Pavey, even his middle name is incorrectly recorded in College records and on the Soldiers Memorial Hall Roll of Honour as HN Pavey. He was generally known at the College as "Snowy". Born in Middlesex, London, and a Pianoforte maker by trade he was employed as a Steward at HAC. Pavey enlisted with the 3rd Battalion in August 1914, and embarked from Sydney aboard the *Euripides* in October. He was briefly hospitalised on Lemnos with illness, which meant he did not arrive on the Gallipoli Peninsula until May 7. He was promoted to Corporal in late June 1915, while on Gallipoli, and appointed Lance Sergeant on August 1. Harold was killed in action on August 7 during the Battle for Lone Pine, and his body never recovered. He is commemorated on Panel 19 of the Lone Pine Memorial along with fellow Hawkesbury College men, Douglas, MacFarlane and Webster. His Will shows he had a wife, Lucy, back in England.
