Research-Technology Management (RTM) is an Australian Business Deans Council (ABDC) A-ranked journal in the innovation, R&D management and technology management areas. RTM publishes scholarly articles that are practitioner-focused but grounded in contemporary academic conversations. This seminar focuses on introducing RTM and providing insights into the intricacies of publishing with the journal. Using a recently published article as a case study, you will go through an interactive publishing journey. You will gain pointers on crafting high-quality submissions, avoiding a desk reject, and discovering effective strategies for addressing diverse reviewer feedback.
