Lecture Recording Policy Review	A proposed <i>Producing and Using Multimedia Policy</i> has been developed by LaTTe and was discussed at the 23 May meeting of APAG. Further consultation is being sought.

Flavorite Horticultural Leadership Scholarship

This new undergraduate scholarship is intended for students who are commencing study or currently enrolled in their final year of the Bachelor of Sustainable Agriculture and Food Security. Applicants must demonstrate a willingness to engage with both the academic and the physical context of work in the horticulture industry. The recipient is expected to maintain satisfactory academic progress, maintaining a minimum GPA of 5.0 for the duration of the scholarship.

EA Southee Undergraduate Research Scholarship

This new undergraduate scholarship is intended for students who are enrolled full-time in their final year of the Bachelor of Natural Science (Sustainable Agriculture and Food Security), Bachelor of Natural Science (Animal Science) on the Hawkesbury campus. The recipient is expected to maintain satisfactory academic progress, maintaining a minimum GPA of 5.0 for the duration of the scholarship.

Dahua Planning Scholarship

This new undergraduate scholarship is intended for students who are commencing study or currently enrolled in the third year of the Bachelor of Planning. The recipient is expected to maintain satisfactory academic progress, maintaining a minimum GPA of 5.0 for the duration of the scholarship.

Dahua Civil Engineering Scholarship

This new undergraduate scholarship is intended for students who are commencing study or currently enrolled in the third year of the Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Civil Engineering). The recipient is expected to maintain satisfactory academic progress, maintaining a minimum GPA of 5.0 for the duration of the scholarship.

Tipalea Partners Property Scholarship

An amendment to an existing scholarship; this undergraduate scholarship is for students who are commencing or enrolled full-time in the first year of the Bachelor of Business (Property). The changes to the scholarship include the removal of prior equity criteria, and the addition of the requirement of attendance at a Western Sydney high school.
