Guide for students transitioning from 7195 Diploma in Arts to 1929 Bachelor of Arts (Pathway to Teaching Early Childhood/Primary)

You need to complete 240 credit points including:

- 80 credit points Core
- 80 credit points Arts Major
- 40 credit points Education Studies Early Childhood/Primary Teaching minor
- 40 credit points Flexible subjects Electives

At the College you complete some of the Core and all of the Electives.

You must choose an Arts Major from the list in the Handbook.

PATHWAY CREDITS

Your pathway credits are shown below and can be found online.

Upon successful completion of your Diploma, you will receive full credit for the following subjects:

- HUMN1052 Australian Politics and Active Citizenship
- LANG1029 Foundations of Academic English
- LANG1030 Thinking Critically about Texts and Society
- HUMN1066 Introduction to Culture and Society
- COMM1004 Approaches to Text
- Unspecified Electives 30 credit points

Note: HUMN1052 - Australian Politics and Active Citizenship and LANG1030 - Thinking Critically about Texts and Society can only be counted as electives. This results in 50 credit points of electives in a program that allows only 40 credit points of electives.

If students choose the Culture and Society major, HUMN1066 - Introduction to Culture and Society counts toward both the core and the major, freeing up space to meet the 160 credit points program requirement.

Similarly, if students choose the English major, COMM1004 - Approaches to Text counts toward both the core and the major, keeping their total within 160 credit points.
