#### How much of my time will I need to give?

No risks or discomforts are envisaged for participants.

# How do you intend to publish or disseminate the results?

It is anticipated that the results of this research project will be published and/or presented in a variety of forums. In any publication and/or presentation, information will be provided in such a way that the participant cannot be identified, except with your permission. It will not be possible to identify your survey responses. Your anonymity is guaranteed.

# Will the data and information that I have provided be disposed of?

Please be assured that only the researchers will have access to the raw data you provide. However, your data may be used in other related projects for an extended period of time. Data is usually stored

for 5 years, then destroyed. For example, we might wish to use the data for another similar study next year, or another study from another school may wish to compare results with ours.

# Can I withdraw from the study?

Participation is entirely voluntary and you are not obliged to be involved. If you do participate you can withdraw at any time without giving reason. However, pressing the Submit button on the survey will mean your data will be submitted and anonymised.

If you do choose to withdraw, any information that you have supplied will be deleted, but your data cannot be identified once you submit the survey.

### Can I tell other people about the study?

Yes, you can tell other people about the study by providing them with the Chief Investigator's contact details. They can contact the Chief Investigator to discuss their participation in the research project and obtain a copy of this information sheet.
