




HIGH ACHIEVING TEACHERS PROGRAM



Direct Application for Early Offer (some programs excluded)

Students can apply directly to the University via Studylink portal.

This allows WSU to issue an early Conditional/Provisional Offer pending on final ATAR results (and English requirements for some programs) upon receiving the application.

Bonus Points for International Students at WSU

Up to 10 bonus points in total may be available if you meet one or both of the below criteria:

Regional Adjustment Factors

Students who live in the Western Sydney region, will automatically qualify for five Regional Bonus Points when they apply to study at Western.

Subject Adjustment Factors

Students who achieve outstanding results in relevant HSC or IB subjects.

Guaranteed \$6,000 Multiyear Scholarship

All international students who completed High School in Australia will automatically receive a \$6,000 Multiyear Scholarship on offer.

That's \$18,000 in Scholarship value.
