Entries can be fiction, non-fiction, poetry or prose of **up to 600 words**, and submitted online by 16 May 2025.

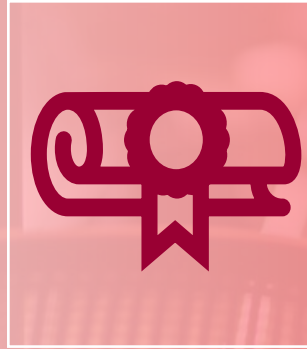

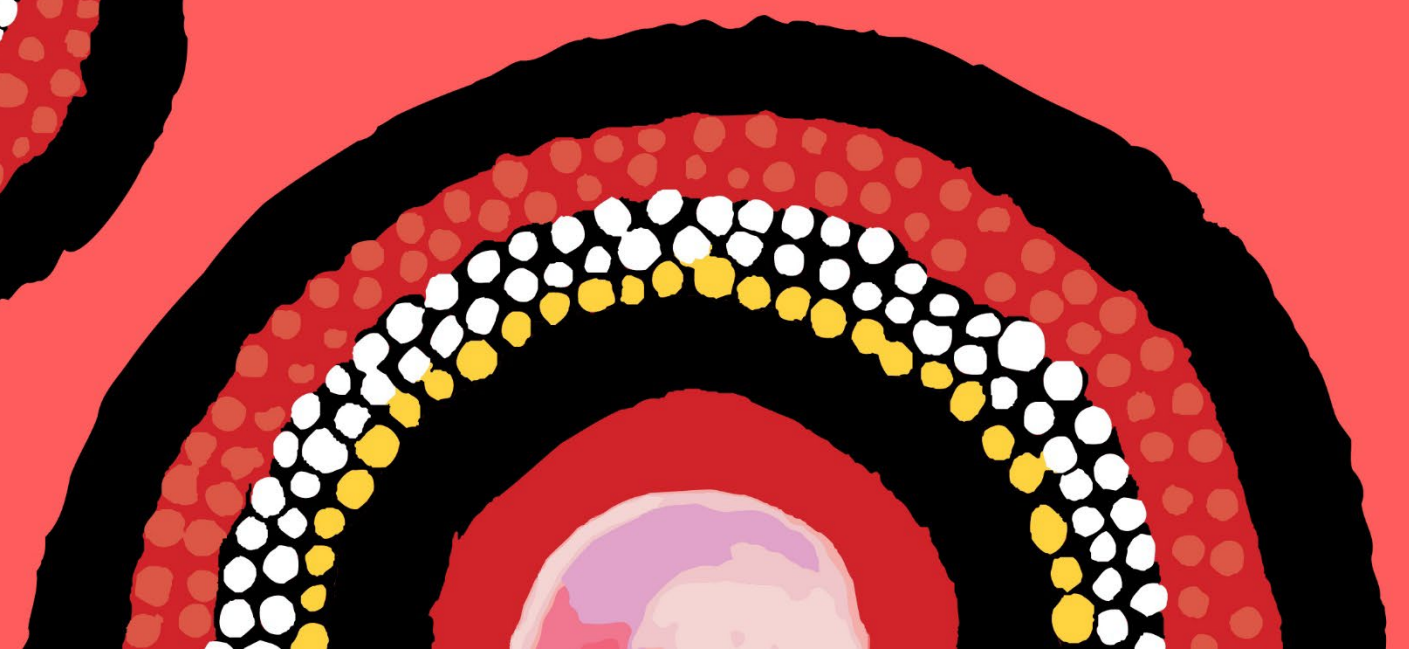

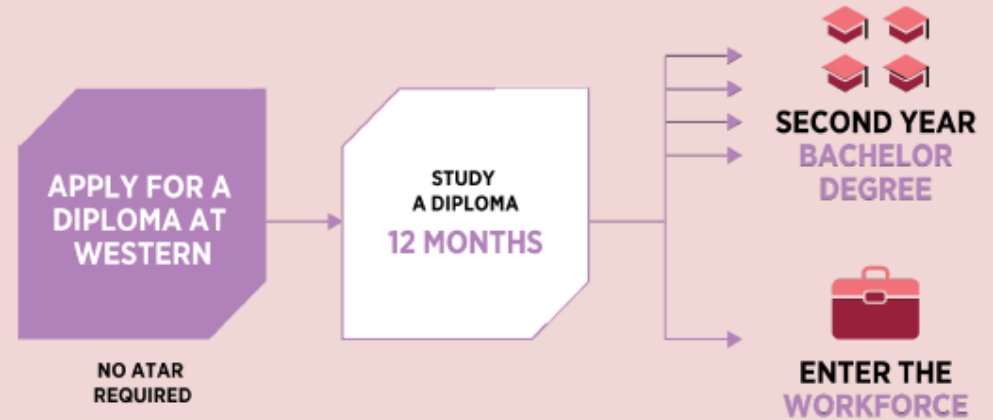
