

USING ADOBE PREMIERE RUSH MOBILE TO RECORD VIDEO WITH YOUR MOBILE DEVICE



Adobe Premiere Rush Mobile is the preferred application for academics to use to record video using their mobile devices. It is a video capture and editing application that is cross-compatible with the Adobe Premiere Rush desktop application.

To use Adobe Premiere Rush Mobile, you will need an Adobe Creative Cloud account. Academics working with Western Sydney University are able to request access to Adobe Creative Cloud through IT Self Service.

Once you arrive at the IT form, in the 'Software name' field enter "Adobe Creative Cloud - Adobe Premiere Rush Mobile". ITDS will respond to your request once your account has been created.

How do start shooting using Adobe Premiere Rush Mobile

First, ensure that your mobile device meets the requirements to install Adobe Premiere Rush Mobile. The system requirements are listed below:

iOS

iOS 12 or later iPhone 7 and newer (devices with A9 ARM chip or higher) iPad (devices with A9 ARM chip or higher)

Android

Operating system: Android 9.0 (Pie or P) and later.

Adobe Premiere Rush is the university's recommended editing application for academic staff at Western Sydney University. It is a capable yet user friendly editing suite that is compatible with both Windows and Mac computers. It is capable of editing lecture and tutorial content that has been recorded in PowerPoint or Zoom.

Installing Adobe Premiere Rush System requirements and Adobe Creative Cloud Access

Before you can install and use Adobe Premiere Rush, you will need to ensure that your computer meets the minimum hardware specifications required to run the program.

If your computer meets these specifications, you will need to gain Adobe Creative Cloud access. Adobe Creative Cloud is Adobe's application platform. Through Creative Cloud, you will have access to a large library of content creation software. Academics working with Western Sydney University are able to request access to Adobe Creative Cloud through IT Self Service.
