Tony aged 48...

- You have been seeing Tony, aged 48, for 2 years.
- He lives at home with his wife and 2 children, has no history of any major mental health issues, and has been working as a primary teacher at the local school for the last 7 years.
- He has well controlled hypertension, and is otherwise well, but 3 months ago slipped over and hurt his low back.
- He has been doing active exercises prescribed by his physiotherapist, and has trialled both paracetamol and ibuprofen in therapeutic doses, but finds his pain is still severe.
- There are no 'red flags' indicating any underlying sinister conditions causing the pain. He
 is struggling to do basic tasks at home like gardening and shopping.
- He asks you if you could prescribe 'something stronger.'

What are 3 aspects of a good framework for management of chronic non-malignant pain?

- Bio-psycho-social
- Active treatments
- Monitor and treat function & life enjoyment as well as pain

What are some important considerations if trialling an opioid for treatment of chronic non-malignant pain?

Jessica aged 28.....

- You have known Jessica, aged 28 years, for many years.
- She had fractured her right wrist 8 months ago, and was prescribed 'Endone' at the hospital as part of the discharge plan.
- Jessica comes to see you distressed, and tells you she has been seeing other doctors at times for prescriptions.
- She is currently taking between 40mg 50mg four times a day.
- She swings between asking you for an increased dose of 'Endone,' and telling you that she feels 'out of control' and asking how to stop her 'Endone.'

- Chronic medical disease e.g. IHD, hypertension, diabetes, renal disease, CAL, BBV......
- Mental health issues
- Overdose risk
