

Teaching Space Upgrade & Refresh

Michael Cuthbertson from ITDS provided an update about upgrades to Labs and Zoom spaces across the University noting the completion of work across labs at Kingswood and Hawkesbury, two Zoom Rooms at Grosvenor Place and Collaborative Learning Spaces at Hawkesbury and Parramatta South. Proposed work for the remainder of 2023 will look at upgrades across Campbelltown, Hawkesbury, Parramatta South and Kingswood, with ten College rooms being refreshed at Milperra for decommissioning.

Michael noted that timetabling have said that the number of Zoom Enabled Teaching Spaces (ZETS) are adequately servicing (if not exceeding) current needs.

GitHub and Clara's World

<u>GitHub Classroom</u> and <u>Clara's World</u> were presented in last month's newsletter. Both of these technologies have been endorsed by LaTTe for use by the School of Computing, Data and Mathematical Sciences, as well as The College.
